| <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Rabbit's foot, Bird's nest, and Boston ferns</b>-regular watering and moderate light</li><li>• <b>Spider plant</b>- an low-care plant</li><li>• <b>African violet</b>- prefers bottom watering and bright light to reflower</li><li>• <b>Christmas cactus</b>- a cold tolerant succulent with velvet soft blooms</li><li>• <b>Maranta "Prayer plant"</b>- needs high humidity, use a dry well</li><li>• <b>Hoya carnosa</b>- drought tolerant with waxy leaves and fragrant blooms</li></ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Cast iron plant</b>- an underrated and easy-care houseplant!</li><li>• <b>Haworthia</b>- try chewing on this thick leafed pointy plant!</li><li>• <b>Sedum 'Donkey tail'</b>- bright light and drought tolerant</li><li>• <b>Pilea involucrata</b>- an unusually textured leaf of lime green</li><li>• <b>Peperomia obtusifolia</b>- drought tolerant due to its variegated waxy leaves</li><li>• <b>Areca and Parlor palms</b>- bright light and regular watering are best</li></ul> |
